## 1. GETTING STARTED

## > Inserting a SIM card



- Remove the battery cover.
- Slide the SIM card into the SIM card holder with the gold contacts facing down.
- Slide your data card into the card holder with the gold contacts facing down.


## ) Inserting and charging the battery



- Insert the battery, making sure that the battery contacts touch the phone's gold contacts.
- Slide the battery cover into its position over the battery. You will know it is in the correct position when you hear it click into place.
- Plug the charging cable into the USB port on the top of the phone.
I. Attention: Charge the battery for at least four hours before the first time you use it. Only use batteries and chargers that are permitted for use with this specific model.


## > Turning on the phone

- Pressing the key for at least two seconds switches the phone on.
- To turn the phone off, press the $\circlearrowleft$ key for two seconds again.


## > Using a new SIM card for the first time:

Enter the four-digit PIN code (personal identification number) $\Rightarrow$ Press $\quad$ to confirm the code

I The PIN code is a four-digit number that is intended to prevent somebody else from being able to switch on your mobile phone. You have a maximum of three attempts to enter the correct number. If you enter the wrong number three times in a row, you will only be able to unblock the SIM card with the PUK code. You will find the PIN code and PUK code in the documents supplied by your network operator.
$\Rightarrow$ Select a Language by pressing $\sim$ and $\square \square$ $\Rightarrow$ Set time $\Rightarrow \square$
$\Rightarrow$ Set date $\Rightarrow \square$

You can choose Small or Large $\Rightarrow \square$

## > Saving energy

If a few seconds pass without the phone receiving any input from you, the screen will go blank to save energy. In the event of an incoming call or you pressing any key, the screen will automatically light up again.

## 2. USING THE PHONE

In standby mode the phone is on, but is not
running any applications (calls, SMS messages, etc.).
> Using the menu
Press ) to open the menu.

- Press 国 and/or to flick through the menu items.

At the top of the screen, the menu item currently highlighted will be displayed.

- Press $\llbracket$ to open a menu item.
- Menu items can be selected directly using the digits assigned to them.
- Options which you can select by pressing
$\square$ or $\square$ are displayed at the bottom of the screen.
- To return to standby mode, press $\square$ several times or close the phone.


## > Dual-function keys

Some keys have additional functions if they are pressed and held down for a few seconds:
100 key: Listen to mailbox
${ }^{*+}$ key: + for country code, e.g. +49 for Germany
Torch button: Torch on continuously when the phone is on

## > Incoming call

- To answer: Open the phone.
- To reject: Press or close the phone.
- To mute the ringtone temporarily:

Press the $\square$ button (on the side of the phone).

## > Ending a call

Press $\square$ or close the phone.
) Dialling a number
Enter the number (incl. area code) you want to dial
using the keypad. $\Rightarrow$ Start the call by pressing $\quad 6$.

## > Redialling

When the phone is on standby, press $\downarrow$
to call up your call history.
$\Rightarrow$ Press and to select a number.
$\Rightarrow$ Start the call by pressing $\quad[$.
> Hands-free mode
Press $\quad$ during a call to open the Options and
turn the hands-free function on or off.

## > Writing a message

$\sim$ messages $\Rightarrow$ Write message
Enter text using the keypad.
> Writing using predictive text
Predictive text has been activated on your phone at the factory.

- Press the number key displaying the letter you require once (e.g. press 4
- Once you've pressed several keys, words will automatically be suggested.
- One word will be highlighted in white.

If this is the word you require, you can insert it simply by pressing ${ }^{-3}$, which is also used to insert blank spaces.

- If the word you require is not highlighted, you can use the arrow keys, 国 and/or 国, to move between the suggested words.
When the word you require is highlighted,
confirm your selection pressing the spacebar key 0 .


## > Writing without predictive text

If you don't want to use predictive text, turn it off by pressing
Predictive text input in the Settings menu.
To input text without predictive text, press the respective number key the required number of times for the letter you need.

The symbols available vary according to which language you are using.

## > Input method

## > Sending a message

Options $\Rightarrow$ Send to $\Rightarrow$ Enter a number or
open Contacts by pressing Search.

## > Receiving a message

Received messages are indicated by an audio signal and the symbol

- Press $\quad$ to open a received message immediately.
- To view your message list, select Messages $\Rightarrow$ Received.


## 5. CAMERA AND PHOTO ALBUM

Your phone has a camera. You will find photos you have taken in the menu under Photo album.
> Taking a photo
In standby mode, enable the camera by pressing 0
When the camera is enabled:

- Press to take a photo.
- Press to open Options for the camera.

Available options: Self-timer, Effect,
Size, Quality and Night mode

## > Photo album

Your photos will be saved in the Photo album menu.

- Press and/or to flick through the photo album.
- Press $\square$ to open Options for the selected picture.

Available options: View, Send,
Wallpaper, Contact photo, Rename,
Delete, Delete all and Memory
i. You can connect your phone to a PC using the USB data cable and transfer your photos.

1. You can use a data card to increase the storage capacity of your phone. You can purchase these cards from electronics stores.

## ) Menu items: Alarm clock, Birthday reminder, Calendar, Calculator, Camera, Bluetooth

### 6.1 Alarm clock

- Setting the time

Enable the alarm clock $\Rightarrow$ Enter the time $\Rightarrow$ Confirm by pressing $\quad 1$.
The alarm clock will now go off at the time you have set every day.

- Off: Disable alarm clock
- Switch off the ringing alarm clock by pressing $\boxed{\square}$.
- Mute the alarm by pressing $\square$ or $\square$
(it will ring again after five minutes).


### 6.2 Bluetooth

This function allows you to use Bluetooth-enabled
hands-free kits wirelessly.

> Saving contacts (name and number)

> Searching for contacts:

### 8.1 Sound \& alerts

You can personalise the settings for tones, signals and vibration or select a set of predefined settings (profile).

## > Silent/Sleep mode

## > Meeting/Theater mode

Visual notifications (torch LED flashes, notifications on the external display), device vibrates, no ringtone
> Maximum/Bus mode
Key tones, SMS tone and vibration function activated, ringtone volume is set on maximum

### 8.2 Key tones

Specify whether or not you would like the phone to make an audible signal (click, tone or voice announcement) when a key is pressed.
I. The voice announcement function will only work if English or German has been selected as the phone language.

### 8.3 Auto Pickup

Incoming calls are answered immediately when you open your phone. You can change this setting here.

### 8.4 Voicemail number

Enter the number for your mailbox.
You will find this number in the documents supplied by your network provider.
Press and hold the 100 key to listen to your mailbox.

### 8.5 Security settings

- PIN: PIN request on/off, change PIN
- Phone code: on/off, change (factory preset code: 1234)


### 8.6 Master reset

You can restore all the factory settings on your phone (factory preset code: 1234).

## 9. EMPORIA EMERGENCY CALL FUNCTION

Read the instructions carefully and set the emergency call function according to you needs.
You can save up to five emergency numbers (family members, friends and official institutions).

- In an emergency press and hold the emergency button on the back of the phone. (This works even when the phone is closed.)
- The five preset numbers will be dialled automatically in the order you have saved them in. The phone will go through a list of five numbers a maximum of three times.
- At the same time as each emergency call, a text message (SMS) will be sent to the contact, saying:
"You are about to receive an emergency call. An audible warning signal will sound when you answer the call. Please press the 0 key three times to establish the connection."
i. The contact must press the 0 key three times within 60 seconds, or the call will be disconnected (to prevent your emergency call going through to a contact's mailbox).
- From the moment you make an emergency call, your emporia phone will automatically answer any incoming calls for one hour. To disable this function, press and hold the $\square$ button for approx. three seconds or turn your device off completely using the button and then turn it on again.
- To cancel the emergency call, press and hold $\quad$.
- During the emergency call, a warning tone will sound continuously, to alert anyone nearby and the person being called.
- If you do not have any emergency numbers saved, have no credit on your prepaid phone card or are connected to a foreign network without permission (e.g. roaming is not activated), 112 will be dialled when you press the emergency button.


## I If you want to add the number of an official institution such as the

 police or fire brigade as an emergency number, you must check that this is okay with the respective institution beforehand. We do not assume liability for any costs incurred through you calling such an institution by mistake.

## ) Safety information
